BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING THE MONARCH AT ROYAL HIGHLANDS, INC. February 14, 2020

A meeting of the Board of Directors for The Monarch at Royal Highlands, Inc. was held at 8:30 a.m. in the Great Hall Meeting Room. Those present: Dick Sjogren, Steve Ryan, Vince Laverghetta, Bill Ortbals, Steve Bryan, Ann Carter and Therese Buono. Bob Keating and Esther Patterson were absent. Craig Misch, General Manager, Terry Stephenson, Course Superintendent, and Linda Eaton, F/B Director, Crown & Shield, were also in attendance.

President - Dick Sjogren

Dick Sjogren called the meeting to order.

The Minutes of the January 24 meeting were approved.

The Minutes of the January 10 meeting are corrected to remove the Johnsons as Seasonal Equity members, as this was reported in error.

Superintendent's Report - Terry Stephenson

- Trap rake down; parts ordered.
- Put out pre-emergence on fairways, tees, roughs and greens.
- Sprayed liquid fertilizer on fairways.
- Put out new flags and cups for Member/Member tournament.
- Still cleaning out areas around wetlands on #5 and #7.
- Sp. rayed 1st application fairy ring control on greens.
- Employee retention a problem; ads running on two sites still not getting any good applicants; we area short 3 employees presently.
- Talked to Scott at Pro Pump. Liebold removing pump station in Chicago on February 28th. They will truck it to Georgia and start furbishing process.
- Our mechanic is cutting back his hours to three days a week. We have a new employee that has mechanic experience so Bill will start training him.

Manager's Report - Craig Misch

Revenue in golf was down \$583 to budget, we did have a very nice month in the golf department even though we were off slightly, they were big numbers to make, so I am pleased. Golf expenses were up \$4330 and that is directly related to us paying the yearly GHIN handicap fee a month earlier than we did last year along with buying tees for our carts in a different month that it was budgeted in because we needed them now. Next month's golf expenses should reflect a much better result.

Course maintenance was over budget \$2307 which is all in accrued payroll. Next month Terry's department should see a lower payroll number because of the accrual and having a shortage in staff. Terry was able to hire two people that will start on Feb 17th.

Food and Beverage Revenue was very good!! Over our budget by \$6674. We had a wonderful revenue month. Kudos to Linda and her staff as well as Justin and his staff. Expenses in food and Beverage were up \$2968 mainly due to payroll...when you're up almost 7000 you're going to spend more money.

Occupancy expenses were also over budget, \$4804. This is directly related to paying the outside accountant later in the fiscal year than we normally do.

We had an overall net income of \$20,262. A little less than projected because of the expenses outlined above.

Dick noted that overall we are \$4,000 ahead of budget and \$15,000 ahead of last year

Craig met with our cart rental company and is hoping to get our lease revised. It's a 6-year lease so nothing can be done until we are into our 3rd year. Craig will keep on top of this.

Ann asked if we have heard from our insurance company regarding the \$2,900 claim we have filed. The answer is that we will probably not pursue it as it may not be worth the time and effort to do so. The \$2,900 has already been written off and we have started new with the new budget year.

The Board of Directors always sponsors a ¼ page ad for the Member Guest Tournament. Each board member is contributing their share for this ad. They will also have a hole sign on the course.

LIAISON

Question:

Can the BOD keep more cash in Ford? We seem to keep much too much on hand with 0% interest. In the past, we were able to keep the cash level between \$20 and \$40 by just watching expected cash flow. On the rare occasion that we had an unusually high bill to be paid quickly, a transfer or check

from the FIA account could be put in BB&T. Dick Therrien developed an excel cash flow demand chart that he and I used. I am not sure, but I think Quicken also has a similar tool. Rosie also kept a schedule of payments due including payroll. It is a simple task to control cash flow. The interest earned return is pretty small, but it costs almost nothing and keeps the business manager and the Treasurer aware of when and what is actually being spent on our expenses.

Dick asked about having green sand especially during member guest. We will check out the difference in price and discuss at next meeting.

The Emergency Equity Membership Meeting called on February 3, 2020 was attended by a quorum of equity members, and the required votes were obtained to approve spending the necessary funds not to exceed \$150,000 to replace the pump station for the golf course.

Dick Sjogren made a motion, seconded by Ann Carter, that we buy a replacement pump station for the golf course not to exceed \$150,000. Motion approved.
