BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING THE MONARCH AT ROYAL HIGHLANDS, INC. July 10, 2020

A meeting of the Board of Directors for The Monarch at Royal Highlands, Inc. was held at 9:00 a.m. in the Crown & Shield. Those present: Dick Sjogren, Steve Ryan, Ann Carter, Esther Patterson, Vince Laverghetta, Steve Bryan, Bob Keating and Bill Ortbals. Therese Buono was absent. Craig Misch, General Manager, Terry Stephenson, Course Superintendent, Lisa Applewhite F/B Manager, Crown & Shield, were also in attendance.

President – Dick Sjogren

Dick Sjogren called the meeting to order. The Minutes of the June 26 meeting are revised and approved to add Bob Hadley effective 5/1/20 and David Fitch effective 7/1/20 to those Off Medical.

Superintendent's Report – Terry Stephenson

- Blue tractor is down hydraulic hose fitting problem. The plan is to cut the Bermuda to 2" and the other rough to 3 ½".
- Equipment and quotes from Wesco and Global Turf for the 3500 Sidewinder are still good as of yesterday. We need to determine if we buy or lease for 3 years. It does not seem feasible to put out \$23,000 at this time not knowing what the future holds. The interest would be about \$2,000 over 3 years if we lease.

Dick Sjogren made a motion seconded by Bob Keating that we lease a used 3500 Sidewinder for 3 years at a cost not to exceed \$25,000. Motion approved.

- Received a quote from Liebold Irrigation for lightning arrestors for satellites. Cost is between \$4000 and \$6000. This is a better price than Wesco (\$4500 \$6000).
- Spot spraying tees/fairways/green surrounds for weeds.
- Talked to Dave at Southern Soils about nematode issues on tees/fairways. The "Curfew" application cost is \$440/acre (for 30 acres) and \$425.00/acre (for 40 acres). I talked to Craig about it and we are thinking about it.
- Sand and fertilize (Milorgonite) the weak areas on greens.
- Fertilize weak areas tees/fairways.
- Spray tees for nematodes again.
- Met with Todd (Howard's Fertilizer) about seed costs for winter grass. Cost is \$14,609 (spent \$800 less last year). Board agreed to put this cost in the budget for next year.

Manager's Report – Craig Misch

Revenue – Month End Actual up almost \$12,000 over last year. As a business, we are \$18,843 above last year. Revenue this month started off great like last month. We are still up \$9,000 to budget for the month so far.

Golf – Member dues are up; Pro Shop is up. Morning shotguns are sold out every day.

F&B – Sales are up \$5500 over budget last year. The restaurant is taking a little hit during this time probably because of COVID.

The air conditioning stopped working during the Couples July 5th tournament. A new belt was put on to fix the problem and then it stopped working again, so put the old belt back on and it has not gone out yet. This is the original air conditioning unit (dating back to the late 90's). Craig is going to get a few quotes on the more energy efficient type units that are on the market.

The internet is working; it has not gone out for almost a week now.

There still is a problem with emails using Golf Now for billing. All members are not getting their emails. We will be looking at other options.

He will also check whether there is an early withdrawal fee and if there are check writing privileges on the account.
