ALL ABOUT TERRY STEPHENSON-
Dave Kozlowski



The purpose of this, and other interviews to come, is to provide our members with an in-depth look at our staff. The interview below is with our Golf Course Superintendent Terry Stephenson.

1. Where were you born and where did you go to school?

I was Born in San Angelo, Texas

I went to High School: Rankin, Texas

I graduated from Sul Ross State University, Alpine, Texas

2. What were your aspirations growing up?

To be a Pro golfer. I played in high school and college

3. How did you first get into the turf business?

I helped a friend, who was a Superintendent, while in college. I worked part-time at Hogan Park Golf Course in Midland, Texas. I also worked for a friend at Kermit Golf Course in Kermit, Texas.

4. How many years have you been at this, and where have you worked and what did you do?

I worked at Mexia Country Club in 1984 as a superintendent/General Manager. In April of 1989 I began working at Rolling Oaks Golf Club, a small club in Waco, Texas and within 5 years became GM for the entire facility. Transferred to Bear Ridge Golf Club, where University

of Baylor enjoyed my introduction and establishment of Tifeagle type grasses. Worked with local and State agencies to reduce usage charges and get refunds. Moved to Florida and became assistant Super in July of 2006. There I learned the ins and outs of Tifdwarf greens and 419 fairways. Also managed a large crew while assisting the Mechanic, the Irrigation Technician and chemical spraying tech.

In 2007 I transferred to Wekiva Golf Club in Longwood working for Sam Floyd as Superintendent.

There I had 8 full time staff members, Tifeagle greens and 419 fairways that were over seeded in winter with Rye grass and Poa Trivals.

5. How did you end up here at Monarch?

In 2010 Sam invited me to join him at The Monarch Golf Club as Superintendent. All my previous experiences have put into play here. We now have the added benefit of the New Toro Osmac Irrigation System which we enjoy.

6. What credential do you have?

I started the Brazos Valley Turfgrass Association in the Central Texas area. It was a means of identifying common problems and solutions. I was also a member of Texas Turfgrass Association for about 20 years. In Florida, I've been a member of the CFGCSA (Central Florida Golf Course Superintendents Association) for 13 years. During this time, I've been a Board Member of the CFGCSA in 2013/2014, Vice President 2015/2016, and President for 2016/2017, and past president for years 2017/2018 and 2018/2019. I'm also on the board (State Level)

of the Florida Golf Course superintendent since 2017.

7. What support do you have in diagnosing problems and capturing savings?

We've been fortunate enough to have direct support from Dr. Bert McCarty and Bob Cross of Clemson University. They are on site many times a year doing evaluations and analysis. Additionally, we are one of several golf clubs that Sheryl Wells from the Bayer Chemical Company gives free samples of test and proven chemicals with support monitoring. We have saved many thousands of dollars in chemicals with that collaboration. We also have contacts from the University of Florida.

I'd like recognize two support people I met when I moved to Florida: Ralph White a consultant for 50 years and Barry Troutman a VP with Valley Crest for 25 years.

Other savings come about when we buy seed, chemicals, and the like in bulk with an early order program

8. Why have goose grass and other undesirable weeds become a growing problem over the last several years?

Don't get me started. TO THE READER – TERRY PROVIDED A 4 PAGE ARTICLE FROM HIS JULY ISSUE OF GOLFDOM.COM MAGAZINE. Here is a summation without the dozens of chemical names. Goosegrass is a problematic annual grassy weed found on golf course turf across the United States in summer. Goosegrass is most commonly found in highly trafficked areas on golf courses such as cart paths entry/exit areas. Preemergence herbicides are a

principal means of controlling goosegrass. Superintendents electing to control goosegrass with pre, post, and reemergence herbicides now have a small group of herbicides from which to choose. None of the options are labeled for use on putting greens and many can induce transient turfgrass injury even when applied under optimal conditions. Goosegrass has become more challenging in recent years. Once confined to more southern states, goosegrass has become a common problem in states as far north as New Jersey and Pennsylvania. A promising spot treating herbicide, MSMA has been prohibited in FLORIDA. Research conducted at UF concluded that soil compaction and the lack of bermudagrass were the major factors in goosegrass infestation. Further research shows the resistance of repeated herbicides and that chemical diversity is critically important.

Terry said he has had some success with an experimental herbicide that he has tested and spotted targeted the goosegrass on parts of the putting area #4 and #11. He also is replacing the normal Spring aerification process in with Dry Jet soil enrichment that helped last year.

It's a costly process but will rejuvenate the soil, push out the goosegrass and other invasive weeds. A healthy Bermuda grass will in fact not give outside intruders a chance.

9. Do you have all the budget, staff, and equipment you need?
Any golf course Superintendent can always use more staff, a bigger budget, better equipment.

However, we work within each club's budget.

10. What does a normal work day look like for you?

I work 4 am – 2 pm.

First hour is paperwork

5 – mow greens

7 – water/spray/check course

9 – spot spray/irrigation work/fix any green issues

11 – fertilize/spray/spot water

11. Do you feel that we will have to replace our greens?

No, if we do things to improve the subsoil, such as DryJett

12. What's the most difficult part of your job?

Staffing

13. You live quite a distance from here and have to get an early start. What motivates you to get going every day?

I enjoy the job. I like to see the sunrise. I'm a morning person. I was taught well by my father.

14. Are you cross-training your assistant, James, to learn the complete job?

Yes.

15. Will James have the contracts you have fostered when you choose to retire?

Some of them. They are getting old too. He will develop new contacts.

16. Your son is also in the business. Do you talk shop when you see him? Tell us about that.

Yes, we talk regularly. He worked for me while still in high school. He learned the process and irrigation. He earned his degree from Penn State while working. He is Vice President of Suncoast Chapter of FGCSA. He works for Pope Golf Company. He is responsible for 2 courses.

17. What would you like to tell the members that these questions haven't touched upon?

I appreciate the opportunity to work here and get to know the members

I appreciate the volunteer help from the members, and that they recognize the relentless efforts of the maintenance staff.
